PLANT TABLE PRICES

Some Club members have mentioned concerns about the prices on the Plant Table. The Board has been struggling with how to deal with the cost of the monthly fee at the Grange going from \$35 to \$88. We will likely ask for \$20 membership next year, instead of \$15. In the meantime, it has been brought up several times that we need to increase the prices at the Plant Table. We have remained firm that we need to keep prices low and not wholesale increase the prices according to size. As a compromise, we've authorized the people working at the Plant Table to price some/many plants INDIVIDUALLY and to have more FLEXIBILITY ACCORDING TO VALUE.

This is, of course, subjective! Our hope is that we still give people good value compared to nurseries and garden centers. Good grief, Annie's Annuals have priced themselves out of my means! Anyway, I wanted to let you know you've been heard and that we're trying for that middle ground. We really appreciate your contributions to the Plant Table.

The Annual Iris Show will be held this year at the London Nelson Center, 301 Center St, Santa Cruz, on May 11 and May 12. The show is open to the public from one until 6 on Saturday and 11 am until 5 pm on Sunday. Admission is free. It is scheduled this time of year when irises are in peak bloom.



The Society says, "We have two main purposes for this show. First, we wish to introduce the interested members of the public to irises. Second, we wish to provide an occasion to judge irises, both unnamed seedlings and established cultivars.

In this show, irises are not judged against other irises of different colors, but are judged for the best possible form, color and size of that particular cultivar. We also judge the skill of the exhibitor in terms of how well the plant has been grown, and how skillfully the stalk has been staged at the show."

The show provides opportunities for growers to display the results of their careful cultivation, to promote interest in the irises, and for gardeners to both observe high-quality specimens and identify varieties to add to their own gardens. With upcoming rhizome sales coming later in summer, this can be a study session in preparation for the gardener's visit to the related plant sales.



The Society's sales this year are scheduled for August 3, 10 and 17.




Aromas Country Garden Tour

You can take plants home by either by paying cash with cash or check, or by bringing plants and other items for trade tickets to use instead of cash. Fill out this form before the meeting if you are going to trade. This is what you'll get for what you bring:

· 2", 3" & 4" pots: 1 ticket each

· 6" pot or 6-pack: 1.5 ticket each

· 1 gallon pot: 2 tickets each

· 2 gallon pot: 3 tickets each

Miscellaneous items are priced at the meeting.

Label your plants with their common or botanical names, and put your name

on them in case purchasers have questions.

Please don't bring loose, dirty plants that would make a mess, or plants you wouldn't be proud to put your name on.

We appreciate all of you who come early to help set up – it's a lot of work! And if you can, plan on staying to help with clean-up.

We'll start accepting plants at 6:40 p.m. The purchase prices are:

· 2", 3", or 4" pots: 2 tickets or \$1 each

· 6" pot or 6-pack: 3 tickets, or \$1.50 each

· 1 gallon pot: 4 tickets or \$2.00 each

· 2 gallon pot: 6 ticket or \$3.00 each

When there are multiples of the same plant available, please take only one until other members have had a chance to buy one. If there are multiples left over, then you can grab them! Plants that don't get sold or given away go home with the person who brought them.
